On Europe Day, the EU institutions traditionally open their doors to the public, allowing citizens to visit these places. It is a great way on bringing the European Union closer to its citizens – but this goal should be pursued throughout the year.

Citizens and civil society organisations can contribute to reaching this goal on a macro-regional level as well. The EU's macro-regional policy is destined to be a special bridge between the EU and European citizens.

We have even taken a step further by starting to develop a macro-regional civil strategy, promoting the European project on regional and local levels. Such a new arrangement brings about an institutionalised form of civil dialogue with place-based communities and regional level CSOs. Such a civil strategy, involving citizens from all macro-regions (Baltic Sea Region, Danube Region, Adriatic and Ionian Region, Alpine Region) will strengthen their ownership feeling and European identity.

If every year we can celebrate on Europe Day that the distance between EU institutions and people living hundreds of kilometres away from the "Brussels bubble" has been further reduced, we certainly make Robert Schuman's dream come true.

This year, Europe Day receives special emphasis as the European Parliament elections are just one month away. The elections' final outcome will shape the EU's political direction over the next five years. Let us do all we can to mobilise citizens and raise awareness about the importance of EP elections, thus supporting the European idea.
